BEAUTIFULLY FLAWED RETREAT

Our Beautifully Flawed Retreat brings young women (ages 15-26) together who have experienced traumatic limb loss or limb difference to show them they are not alone, that God loves them, and He sees their beauty! The healing and hope found at this retreat is truly unmatched in the amputee world. This four-day experience includes activities that inspire, stories from traumatic amputees, Bible teaching, small group connection times, expert advice, and practical health and wellness tips from onsite doctors, trainers and nutrition specialists.

FORGE RETREAT

The Forge Retreat is a four-day experience for men who've faced traumatic limb loss or limb difference to discover strength, hope, and courage. Surrounded by Christ-centered community and having opportunities to surf, wakesurf, and more, attendees discover that overcoming is possible and God is forging them with purpose.

Men leave inspired and encouraged in their faith, empowered by the camaraderie of brothers around them, and confident that God takes the pain (fires) endured in this life and uses them to shape them into the men He's always created them to be.

ENCOURAGEMENT PACKAGES

We send a personalized package to bring joy and encouragement to those who have recently experienced a traumatic event or loss. Reaching out with compassion, we send or hand deliver encouragement packages to help restore hope to those affected. Over the years we have sent hundreds of these packages to individuals experiencing some of their hardest seasons of personal loss.

SHINE FORTH

Shine Forth is a free community event for all generations to be inspired by hope, encouraged in their faith, and reminded through powerful testimonies that overcoming is possible through Jesus. We partner with local churches to host this one-day event where Bethany Hamilton along with former Beautifully Flawed and Forge Retreat attendees share inspiring stories. This is a powerful evening of worship, impartation, and a testament to how God is faithful to heal, restore, and make beauty from ashes.

With a combined total from both retreats of 26 attendees and eight alumni attendees serving as leaders, our attendees experienced the power of community, healing, encouragement in their faith, fun and camaraderie, and ultimately left transformed, inspired with the hope that overcoming is possible.



"The Beautifully Flawed Retreat has been a light

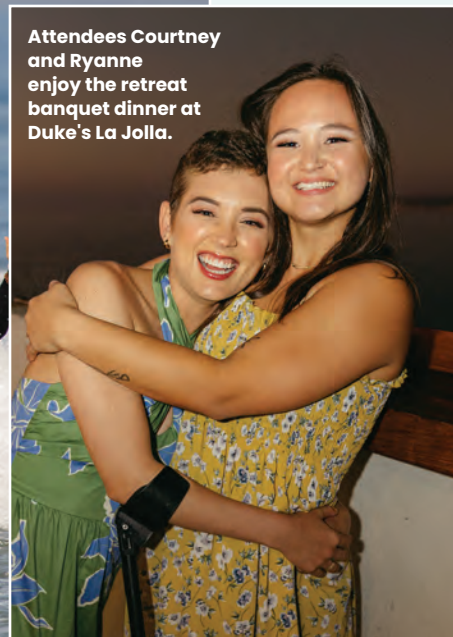
at the end of (or maybe midway through) the tunnel since the very first day I lost my leg in January 2024.

Knowing that no matter how the next few months went, that I'd soon be meeting other girls with limb differences and surfing in the California water again was something I could always, and often did, cling to. I once saw this account post that **'He knew what He was doing and He knew who He was calling.'** That has held me together more times than I can count. This amputation is hard, it's life changing, but it's not random. It's for me and **this retreat helps propel girls with heavy hardships to turn them into Glory."**

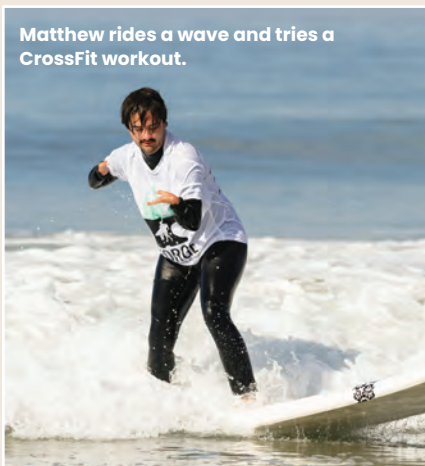

Shine FORTH

From Extreme Loss to Life-Altering Triumphs

On a warm Friday evening, a couple hundred people arrived at The Mission Church in Carlsbad, California to hear stories of hope from four of our past retreat and event attendees. Yet, nothing could have prepared them for the inspirational night ahead.

Shine Forth is a night for past Beautifully Flawed and Forge Retreat attendees to share their stories of extreme loss to life altering triumph with Christ. Bethany Hamilton's story has been an inspiration to millions worldwide, and Shine Forth was created to do the same thing in an intimate in-person event. Hope drives the night and in story after story we hear the thread of God's goodness and provision.

This Shine Forth in particular was very special. Five years had passed since our last Shine Forth in 2019, so we were beyond excited to bring this life-changing event back to the community and knew God was going to do something remarkable.

As each incredible individual shared their story, the ups and downs, the trauma they faced and how God brought them through, tears were shed, hope was imparted, and thanks was given to God for His faithfulness to restore and redeem all things. And ultimately, all left with faith increased and strengthened with the knowledge that Christ can help us to overcome whatever hardships we are walking through.

Nan McMahan, a Beautifully Flawed Retreat attendee, shared her own story of losing her father and her leg on the same day. She paralleled her life and the story of Job in the Bible and recounted how God redeemed Job and restored his wealth and family to him. She has come to know God as the powerful redeemer of painful circumstances as He has given her new life and new joys after tragedy. Her smile and joy was contagious and it radiated through the whole room.

Josh Reed, a Forge Retreat attendee, shared his story of finding strength in the Lord after his accident that left him without a leg. Through trial and recovery, God refined him to become a man of God that powerfully shares with and serves others. His confidence in Christ is clear to see and so many of us were strengthened just hearing him share.

Andrea Zavala, another Beautifully Flawed Retreat attendee, who lost all four of her limbs to sepsis, blew us away with her courage and sweet spirit as she recounted the way God has walked her through hardship. He has been an ever present help in her troubles and He will be in all of ours as we look to Him. Andrea walks through the difficulties of being a quadruple amputee with a grace that is palpable and she left us all hopeful and thankful to the Lord for His presence.

Then a surprise came for us, when a full circle story came from Heather Foster, a woman who previously attended Shine

Forth with her family, and then tragically lost her legs a few months later to sepsis. She shared how coming to Shine Forth before she lost her limbs had prepared her to walk the difficult journey ahead and gave her hope for life after her amputations. We were inspired to hear how she and her family found hope and courage in Christ to overcome this painful loss. To see how Heather is living a vibrant and beautiful life today and embracing all God has given her – she is a testament to God making beauty from ashes.

The night of Shine Forth was uplifting and the testimonies of resilience left us all aware of God's provision and redemptive power. We look forward to all that God will do through the stories shared at Shine Forth this year. *BF*

Wakesurfing

For the last two years, Beautifully

Flawed Foundation (BFF) has had the incredible opportunity to partner with Brave the Wave Co. and Liquid Force to bring wakesurfing to our men's Forge Retreat. It is always a day full of camaraderie, adapting, and pushing past limits. "Wakesurfing is an activity many people with a physical disability think they will never be able to accomplish. By providing the skills of adaptive wakesurfing coaching, we hope to show each rider they are capable of doing whatever they put their mind to," shared Lexi Kuppler, owner of Brave the Wave Co., BFF Board Member, and below-the-knee amputee.

Since this event has become such a huge highlight at our men's retreat, we decided to bring wakesurfing to our 2024 Beautifully Flawed Retreat for the first time ever! To say the girls were ecstatic to wakesurf is an understatement. The girls boarded boats on the Carlsbad Lagoon in San Diego, California first thing in the morning and didn't return until late afternoon.

"I went wakesurfing for the first time at the retreat and it was surreal. I loved being on the water and looking at the boat to see all the girls and hear their words of encouragement. I gained so much confidence when I was able to stay on the board!" said Kayley, 2x retreat attendee and above-the-knee amputee.

It was a beautiful sunny day out on the lagoon and whether they were on the boat laughing, chatting, and singing karaoke songs or in the water shredding waves for the first time, the Beautifully Flawed attendees had the time of their lives.

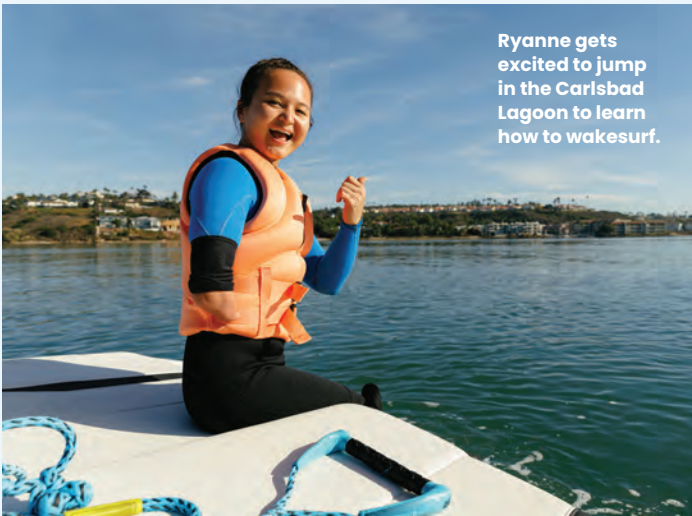

BFF Retreat Brings Healing and Breakthrough

Ashley Igo is the BFF Board Vice-Chair – she brings professional expertise as a mental health therapist to the BFF community, as well as her personal experience as a traumatic amputee and overcomer.

Ashley is working and serving clients in and around her home in Texas where she lives with her family and plethora of pets. We asked her to share how these retreats impact the healing journey of each of our attendees.

BEAUTIFULLY FLAWED FOUNDATION: How did you come to be part of the BFF Community?

ASHLEY IGO: I attended my first Beautifully Flawed Retreat in 2014 after my friends Lauren Scruggs Kennedy and Lisa Curlee encouraged me to apply. I've been an attendee or leader almost every year since, and it's absolutely the highlight of each year.

BFF: What do you believe makes the BFF retreat such a powerful setting for breakthrough and healing?

ASHLEY: Through my lens as a mental health therapist, I see our retreats as a group therapy experience. For most of the attendees, day to day life doesn't include interaction with amputees or people with limb difference. At the retreat, girls and women from all over the world are able to connect through shared experience. There's something

so healing about the shared sense of empathy that is ever present, be it during an adaptive workout or a small group session.

BFF: How have you seen the BFF retreat environment (setting, group dynamics, or activities) contribute to emotional and spiritual healing of our attendees?

ASHLEY: It's incredibly inspiring to watch attendees step into leadership roles at subsequent retreats. Each year, we witness firsthand how the Lord has shaped them through their personal journeys and continues to use their experiences to encourage and uplift others and point to His goodness. Attendees' healing and growth is evident in the increased confidence they carry year to year, the deepened trust they have in Jesus, and, for some, even improved mobility.

BFF: What advice do you have for individuals who are seeking healing or breakthrough, whether or not they attend a BFF retreat?

ASHLEY: Healing is much like a three-legged stool, each leg representing

a different aspect of our well-being: spiritual, physical, and mental. Each leg is essential, and without one, the stool becomes unsteady, just as we cannot experience healing without tending to all three of these aspects of our lives.

Though we won't experience complete healing until reunion with Christ, nurturing these three areas is essential this side of Heaven.

BFF: How do you hope the healing process at retreats will continue to grow in the future?

ASHLEY: Hope for future retreats and Beautifully Flawed programs lies in a deepened understanding of knowing the Lord and embracing His purpose for us to live in community. These gatherings offer more than just moments of respite; they create spaces where we can connect, grow, and build lasting relationships grounded in faith. With the introduction of the new virtual Bible study, Pleasant Life, there is an incredible opportunity to continue these connections beyond the retreats.

This program offers a way for us to stay engaged with attendees as we navigate life's various stages—getting married, raising children, enduring surgeries, and more. It's a vision for long-term community, where relationships extend far beyond the retreat experience, allowing us to support and encourage one another in our physical, spiritual, and mental health. Through these ongoing connections, we can share our struggles, celebrate our victories, and grow together in faith for decades to come. *BF*

Band of Brothers



There comes a time in our lives when life doesn't go as planned. When tragedy hits and adversity strikes, we find ourselves swirling downward in doubt, confusion, and pain, our faith tested to what seems like the limits. It's in these moments we realize we can't do this on our own.

If it wasn't for Jesus, a band of brothers, and community, **Cam Ayala** would have a very different story to tell. > > >

Born with a painful disease called Lymphedema, Cam Ayala experienced chronic pain, swelling and infections in his body as a result of it. In 2022, he went in for a knee replacement surgery, hopeful that this would improve his state of living. However, the surgery didn't go as planned. Due to a surgeon error, Cam was faced with a weighty decision. On June 22, 2022, Cam opted to have an above the knee amputation on his right leg.

Journey to Recovery

The journey to recovery and navigating limb loss wasn't easy to be sure: "When my amputation first took place, I was afraid [and] ashamed to look at my body in the mirror because I felt like I was inadequate. It is easy to tell ourselves that we are 'fearfully and perfectly made' (Psalm 139), but to TRUST and BELIEVE in that is another level of faith."

Yet, if it hadn't been for his faith in Jesus and his strong community — believers and the limb loss community — who rallied around him in the healing journey, those days, weeks, and months after his limb loss would have looked drastically different. "Community has been EVERYTHING to me in my limb loss journey. But more importantly, my community of believers has transformed my faith journey. I had

people who love me reinforce that I am Complete-IN-Christ. It really did help me overcome that challenge. Even the day after my amputation, I had countless people in the limb loss and limb difference [community] pour their love, support, and knowledge onto me. I know that because of God's grace, mercy, and the collaborative nature of ALL my communities that I am able to live the life I do today." Having experienced the power of this firsthand, Cam felt called to begin mentoring and coming alongside individuals fighting disease, Lymphedema, or journeying through limb loss.

A Pivotal Meeting

Because of his relationships within the limb loss community, Cam came to meet Chris Rains, a 3x Forge Retreat attendee at the time. When interviewing Chris on his podcast "Above & Below" in 2023, Cam heard about the retreat for the first time. Fast forward one year, Cam found himself in a wetsuit in the Pacific Ocean, relying on his favorite mantra "Faith Over Fear" to face his fear of the sea and sharks, and learning how to adaptive surf at the 2024 Forge Men's Retreat. Never had he imagined he'd overcome that fear, stand up on a surfboard and catch a wave as a leg amputee, let alone do CrossFit, jiu jitsu, and wakesurfing as well. "But God did," Cam said.

But that wasn't all God had in store for Cam. Little did he know, God brought him to the Forge to bless him with something he didn't even realize how much he needed — a community of men who were not only brothers in Christ, but brothers in limb difference as well.

Discipleship and Growth

tears, hugs, prayer, and encouragement. That's what discipleship is all about. Healing happened in that moment, and not just for my brother, but for me as well. I now have a band of brothers that I can call or text anytime. There are not just my brothers-in-Christ, but brothers who are also living with limb loss/limb difference who understand me in ways in which no other Christian brothers have ever been able to."

Knowing this group of men opened the door for complete vulnerability. It created space for all to bring 100% of themselves to the table, to be raw and honest about struggles as men and as men journeying through limb loss. Because of that, the healing and relationships formed were nothing like Cam had known before — he found a band of brothers he'll have for life. *BF*

Sometimes it feels as if darkness has us surrounded. Hope can seem completely lost and the tragedy too great to overcome. But then, in the midst of it all, there comes a whisper that says, "courage, dear heart." It's a whisper much like Aslan's (the Jesus figure in the Chronicles of Narnia) to a girl named Lucy who was riddled with fear, hopelessness, and burdened by a weight she didn't think she could carry. And yet, those three words set her free.

Dear Heart"

Casey and Bethany Hamilton re-connect at Casey's second Beautifully Flawed Retreat.

It's a whisper that releases perfect peace and breathes hope into the soul. It heals the broken-hearted and infuses strength and bravery back into one's bones. It's the voice of the Savior reminding us of who we are, that we're never alone, and He will carry us through.

This is a glimpse of what Jesus has done in Casey Parker's story. In the dark seasons, Jesus was right there with her, imparting hope and courage, orchestrating divine encounters and putting people in her life that would help her through.

At a very young age, Casey encountered great loss. Born with a disorder called Proximal Femoral Focal Deficiency (PFFD) that causes the upper part of the femur bone to either be malformed or missing, Casey became an above the knee amputee in December 2001. She was only one year old. Experiencing limb loss at such a tender age and going through 10 major surgeries afterwards, her childhood was a very difficult one, forcing her to have to grow up quickly. She was faced with the insecurities of feeling "less than," doubting her God-given worth, which were only accentuated by strangers' stares, being treated differently, and even denied jobs.

By a completely divine encounter in 2013, Casey met Bethany Hamilton where she learned about the Beautifully Flawed Retreat for young women with limb difference. Taking a leap of courage, she applied to attend the upcoming retreat and a year later, at 14 years old, Casey found herself learning to adaptively surf at the foundation's second-ever retreat: "I love the surf day. There's just something about watching how excited the girls get catching their first wave. I always feel closer to God whenever I'm near the ocean, and because of the retreat, surfing has become one of my new favorite hobbies."

The retreat so profoundly impacted her life, that Casey decided to return as an attendee again in 2017 and 2024. But these two times were different. Listening to the whisper of courage, Casey made the decision to overcome the shyness that had held her back at her first retreat. Finally allowing her walls to come down and giving room for



Jesus to move and heal in only ways He could do, Casey found the freedom, healing, and friendships she'd been longing for: "When I'm at the retreat, I feel seen and heard in ways that foster true connection. I'm able to embrace vulnerability, talk

about my struggles, celebrate my successes, and share my hopes and ideas for the future with friends who understand life with limb loss. I walk away inspired and thankful to know such brave women [and] I know any one of [them] would be there for me in a heartbeat if I needed them."

God knew what Casey needed even before she did herself. Because of her listening to the Holy Spirit's prompting and stepping out in courage, Casey discovered beautiful, life-giving friendships in women who inspired her with their resilience, bravery, and vulnerability. She found people who would be there for her, uplift her in her darkest moments, all the while, reminding her of who God created her to be. *BF*
